




Midwife Attended U.S. Births 1989-2015








Attendants at Home Births in the U.S., 2015





Home Births Attended by CNMs and Other Midwives


Proportion of all home Births Attended by CNMs, 2003-2015

So, we can see there are different patterns in the settings in which CNMs & Other Midwives work.


Are the women served by CNMs and Other Midwives different?

In summary, the populations served by CNMs and Other Midwives are far more similar than different.

Other Midwives & CNMs have far more in common than they have differences and working together to support mothers' and infants in both home and hospitals is far more productive than emphasizing differences.
